## **Aberdeen Featured in *Where to Retire* Magazine**

Houston, TX (Feb. 13, 2018) – Aberdeen, MS, a recognized city in the Hometown Mississippi Retirement program, has been featured by *Where to Retire*, the only magazine in America geared toward helping people with retirement relocation decisions. The Hometown Mississippi Retirement program is profiled as part of the magazine’s series on various states’ retirement relocation programs. The Mississippi program has been luring retirees for 25 years and recognizes 13 certified retirement cities in Mississippi. Each city is vetted to make sure it would appeal to retirees and must have an endorsing agency.

*Where to Retire* Editor Annette Fuller said the certified cities have plenty to brag about. “The state has beautiful lakes and beach, plenty of outdoor sports and lush scenery. I interviewed a couple from one of the 13 cities, Aberdeen, 40 miles south of Tupelo. They highlighted the state’s low cost of living, friendly residents and Aberdeen’s marina on the Tombigbee River. ‘Coming to this area was like coming home,’ one retiree said.”

Each year, 700,000 Americans relocate to new towns to retire. Generally, relocating retirees are healthier, better educated and more affluent than those who choose to not relocate. They bring significant economic benefits to their new states and hometowns. Nationally, two dozen states and hundreds of towns seek to attract retirees as a source of economic development.

*Where to Retire*, now in its 26th year of print, is published six times a year. The magazine covers the best retirement regions, towns and master-planned communities, and recently released its 10th biennial list naming the [50 best master-planned communities](#) in the U.S. It has a national circulation of 200,000 and is sold on various newsstands and at Barnes & Noble bookstores.
