



NAVY COMBAT VET SWIMS THROUGH VICKSBURG EN ROUTE TO BECOME 1ST AMERICAN TO SWIM LENGTH OF MISSISSIPPI RIVER

Who: Legacies Alive, Chris Ring, the Swim For Their Sacrifice Team, Gold Star Families, and the City of Vicksburg

What: Navy Combat Veteran Chris Ring, with "Swim For Their Sacrifice", will be stopping in Vicksburg to meet with local Gold Star Families

Why: Legacies Alive is sponsoring Chris Ring, a Navy Combat Veteran as he becomes the **1st American** to swim the entire length of the Mississippi River in honor of our fallen heroes and their Gold Star Families. Chris is swimming an average of 20 miles a day, covering 2552 miles over 6 months.
