HBURG ZOO HOSTS 20th ANNUAL ZOOBOO, OCT. 25 - 30

HATTIESBURG (October 3, 2017) – Join Hattiesburg Zoo for five fun, safe nights of family-friendly Halloween excitement at the 20th annual ZooBoo on Oct. 25 through Oct. 30 from 5:30 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Each night, Hattiesburg Zoo will transform into an enchanting setting fit for the scariest goblins and the most delicate princesses. Guests will enjoy Halloween decorations throughout the Zoo, Jeepers Creepers Keepers animal encounters, themed games, unlimited rides on the Spooktacular Express and Carou-spell, Monster Mash Dance Party, animal shows, fortune telling, campfire stories, and a 53-foot obstacle course with an inflatable slide.

“With a twist on the typical Halloween activities, the Zoo provides a safe and exciting environment for families. ZooBoo has become a tradition for many in the area, and we are looking forward to another thrilling year of spirited fun,” Rick Taylor, Executive Director of the Hattiesburg Convention Commission, said.
