The tourism industry in Mississippi is stronger than ever, and the demand for travel to our state continues to be robust. Statistics indicate that, on average, approximately **\$32.6 million** was spent every day of 2024 by Mississippi visitors.

The direct visitor spend of **\$11.9 billion**, combined with indirect and induced impacts totaling **\$6.2 billion**, generate a total economic impact of **\$18.1 billion**

136,094 tourism-supported employees translates to **one-in-13 jobs** in Mississippi is tourism-related.

Of the **\$11.9 billion** spent, food and beverage purchased accounted for **\$3.0 billion – 25 percent** of all visitor spending.

How does tourism impact MARSHALL County?



In 2024, direct visitor spending in the county totaled \$52.1 million.
This breaks down to:

- \$8.2 million in Lodging
- \$9.5 million in Food & Beverage
- \$6.7 million in Recreation
- \$7.5 million in Retail
- \$20.1 million in Transportation

Indirect and induced spending totaled \$35.8 million for a combined
total economic impact of \$87.9 MILLION

740 employees were directly related to the tourism industry,
and 301 were indirect related. Combined, there are 1,041 jobs
supported by the county's tourism economy.

These tourism employees made a total of \$28.6 million in income.

Tourism generated \$4.6 million in
state and local taxes for the county

- \$1.9 million in Direct State Taxes
- \$1.2 million in Indirect State Taxes
- \$1.0 million in Direct Local Taxes
- \$0.6 million in Indirect Local Taxes
